Inclusive, regionally competitive and climate resilient livestock market systems in pastoral and agro-pastoral communities create sustainable livelihood and employment opportunities and empower women for improved household wellbeing in the arid and semi- arid areas of Ethiopia, Kenya and Somali.

The RLP aims to achieve more climate resilient, inclusive, and sustainable livelihoods for pastoral and agro-pastoral communities in target trade corridors. This will be accomplished by strengthening value chain and natural resources governance, reinforcing business and social networks, and co-investing in financial and technical resources in order to build and expand gender-equitable, affordable access to public and private goods, services, and natural resources for improved livestock productivity and expanded economic opportunities along priority trade corridors. Partner organisations are IGAD, Mercy Corps, and Helvetas with Welthungerhilfe (WHH). The project targets Pastoralists and agro pastoralists living in the project area targeting 29,926 HHs (149,630 direct beneficiaries).
