



## HELVETAS MOZAMBIQUE PROGRAMME

HELVETAS in Mozambique collaborates with partners from government, private sector and civil society to improve the living conditions and resilience of women and men in Cabo Delgado, Nampula and Niassa Provinces. It implements development projects and initiatives responding the humanitarian needs of the local population. The Country Strategy for 2022-2026 provides and defines the direction and scope of programmatic and development priorities for the five year period.

HELVETAS contributes to an effective and efficient improvement of the living conditions of economically and socially disadvantaged women and men, both in rural areas and small towns, protected from shocks and to the transition to a more inclusive and resilient society.

#### BUDGET

Total annual budget (2024): 7.1 million CHF.

# OUTCOMES (2022)

- 111,853 people (58,237 women (52%); 108,628 disadvantaged (97%) have gained access to water supply.
- 146,642 people (76,517 women (52%); 144,394 disadvantaged (98%) have gained acess to improved sanitation facilities.
- **3,685** people (1,068 women (29%); **2,310** disadvantaged (63%) have increased their productivity for peanut and cashew production.
- HELVETAS regularly participates and contributes in the Water and Sanitation Group and participates in the informal groups stimulated by Agenda of Change.
- 634 young people (277 women (44%) participated in a skills training (vocational, agricultural, technical) and 188 (92 women (49%) have successfully completed the training.
- 630 agricultural cooperatives are in the process of organic certification, of which 6 have been already audited by Ecocert for this purpose.
- Helvetas through AMCANE project contributed to the export of the first batch of organic cashew nuts to Netherlands, in partnership with Ouro Verde.
- 51 healthcare facility in 7 of districts of Cabo Delgado province have benefited from 3,190 litres of medicinal alcohol.
