



ABOUT CALL PROJECTS

CALL Consortium is united in climate adaptation and resilience-building in Bangladesh. With support from the Embassy of Switzerland, the CALL Consortium, comprising 9 Swiss NGOs and 18 local partners, works across **30 districts** of Bangladesh to empower **2 million** marginalised and local people through **12 projects**.

The Climate Action at Local Level (CALL) portfolio brings together a diverse set of locally anchored, rights-based and climate-responsive initiatives that address Bangladesh’s most pressing climate, social, and economic vulnerabilities.

The CALL programme is being implemented across climate hotspots—from coastal and riverine districts to urban and industrial centres — to strengthen community capacity for disaster management and climate resilience, enhance local economies, and share knowledge gained at the local to international levels.

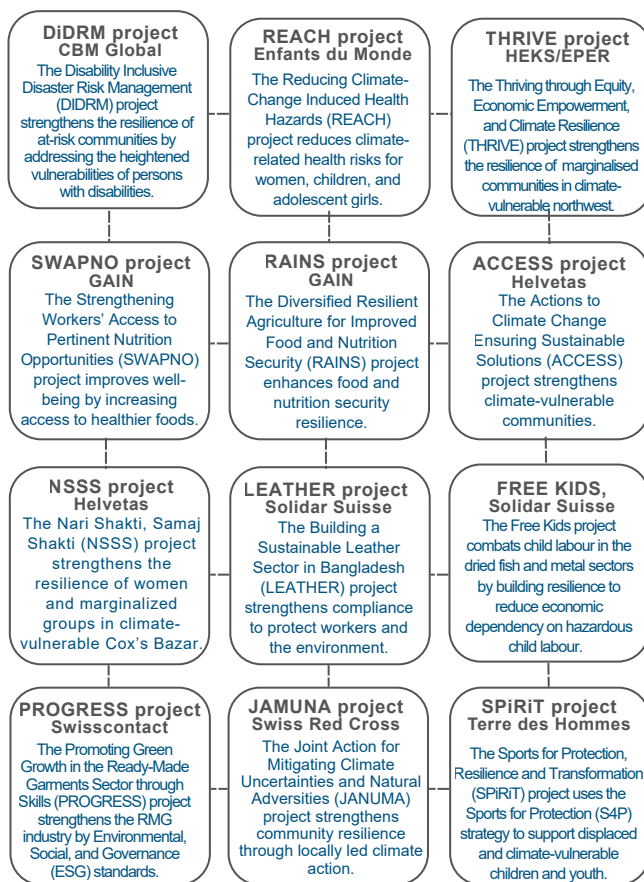


Figure: CALL projects - at a glance

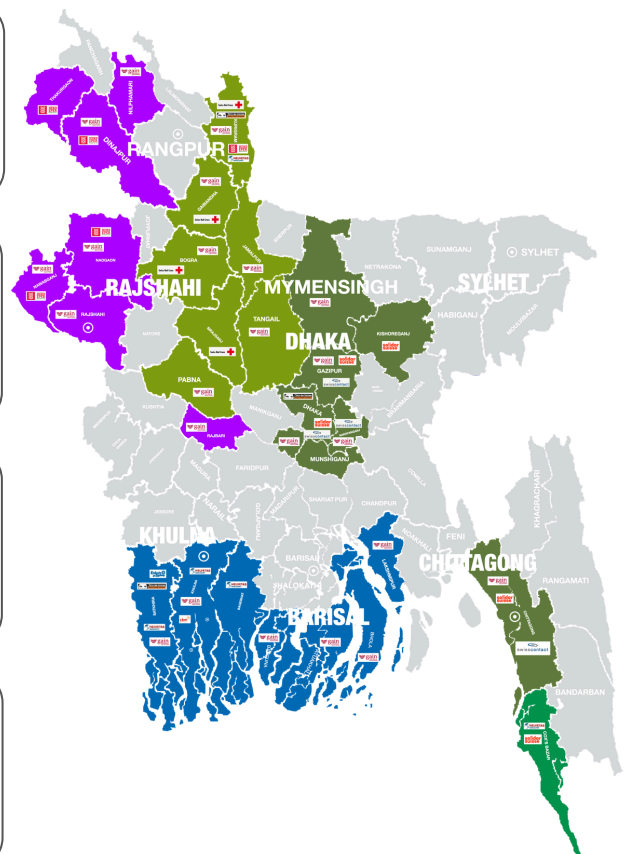


Figure: CALL coverage

DiDRM

The 'Disability Inclusive Disaster Risk Management (DiDAM)' project strengthens resilience of at-risk communities by addressing the heightened vulnerabilities of persons with disabilities, ensuring accessible disaster preparedness, promoting their active participation, and reducing barriers that limit safety, livelihoods, and inclusion during climate-induced disasters.

Component: Disability inclusion disaster risk reduction, social protection targeting persons with disabilities

REACH

The 'Reducing Climate-Change Induced Health Hazards (REACH)' project reduces climate-related health risks for women, children, and adolescent girls by strengthening their decision-making skills, improving public health system capacity, and generating evidence to inform national policy for resilient maternal, newborn, child, and adolescent health.

Component: Health education, service accessibility, climate impact targeting adolescent girls and women

THRIVE

The 'Thriving through Equity, Economic Empowerment, and Climate Resilience (THRIVE)' project strengthens the resilience of planland Adibashis, Dalits, and other marginalised communities in climate-vulnerable north and northwest Bangladesh by expanding access to rights and services, promoting economic empowerment, and supporting evidence-based advocacy to improve coping capacities against drought, floods, and other climate and non-climate stresses.

Component: Resilient livelihoods, access to public services targeting plainland Adibashis, Dalit, marginalised

Location: Kurigram, Thakurgaon, Dinajpur, Chapai Nawabganj, Naogaon

SWAPNO

The 'Strengthening Workers' Access to Pertinent Nutrition Opportunities (SWAPNO)' project improves wellbeing by increasing access to healthier foods through greater awareness, workplace provision of nutrition options, and community demand supported by training, behaviour-change communication, and nutrition centres promoting safe and affordable diets.

Component: Access to nutrition, climate-adaptive food supply targeting factory workers, low-income families

The 'Diversified Resilient Agriculture for Improved Food and Nutrition Security (RAINS)' project enhances food and nutrition security resilience by adapting climate-resilient technologies, enabling market-responsive, women-empowering production decisions, and increasing community satisfaction to withstand environmental and economic shocks.

Component: Social Behavioural Change Communications, nutrition-sensitive food system targeting farmers and union multi-stakeholders

NSSS

The 'Nari Shakti, Samaz Shakti (NSSS)' project strengthens the resilience of women and marginalised groups in climate-vulnerable Cox's Bazar by promoting economic empowerment, leadership and disaster preparedness to build safer, more inclusive and climate-resilient communities.

Component: Livelihood, leadership, disaster preparedness targeting Rohingya & host community women

Location: Rohingya Camps (3, 4, 11, 12, 24, 25 & 26); Host community (Ukhiya & Teknaf upazilas)

LEATHER

The 'Building a Sustainable Leather Sector in Bangladesh' project aims to strengthen social dialogue and improve compliance across the leather value chain to safeguard workers' rights and protect the environment. By empowering civil society organisations, trade unions, and factory owners, the project promotes Occupational Safety Health (OSH), addresses environmental pollution, and contributes to safer, more sustainable livelihoods for workers in these key export sectors.

Component: Occupational safety, rights, environmental protection targeting CSOs, trade unions, state actors

Free kids

The 'Free Kids' project combats child labour in the dried fish and metal sectors by strengthening stakeholder capacity, providing education and market-aligned skills for child labourers, and supporting climate-migrant families with resilient livelihoods to reduce economic dependency on hazardous child work, particularly among children from climate-migrant families working in these sectors.

Component: Behavioural change to eliminate child labour targeting climate-induced migrant (children & parents)

The 'Promoting Green Growth in the Ready-Made Garments Sector through skills (PROGRESS)' project improves the competitiveness of the RMG industry by enhancing worker skills, expanding decent jobs for women, and supporting factories and local service providers in adopting energy-efficient practices and meeting global Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) standards.

Component: Resilient livelihoods, WASH, health, and early warning targeting the extreme poor, local government units, and disaster management committees

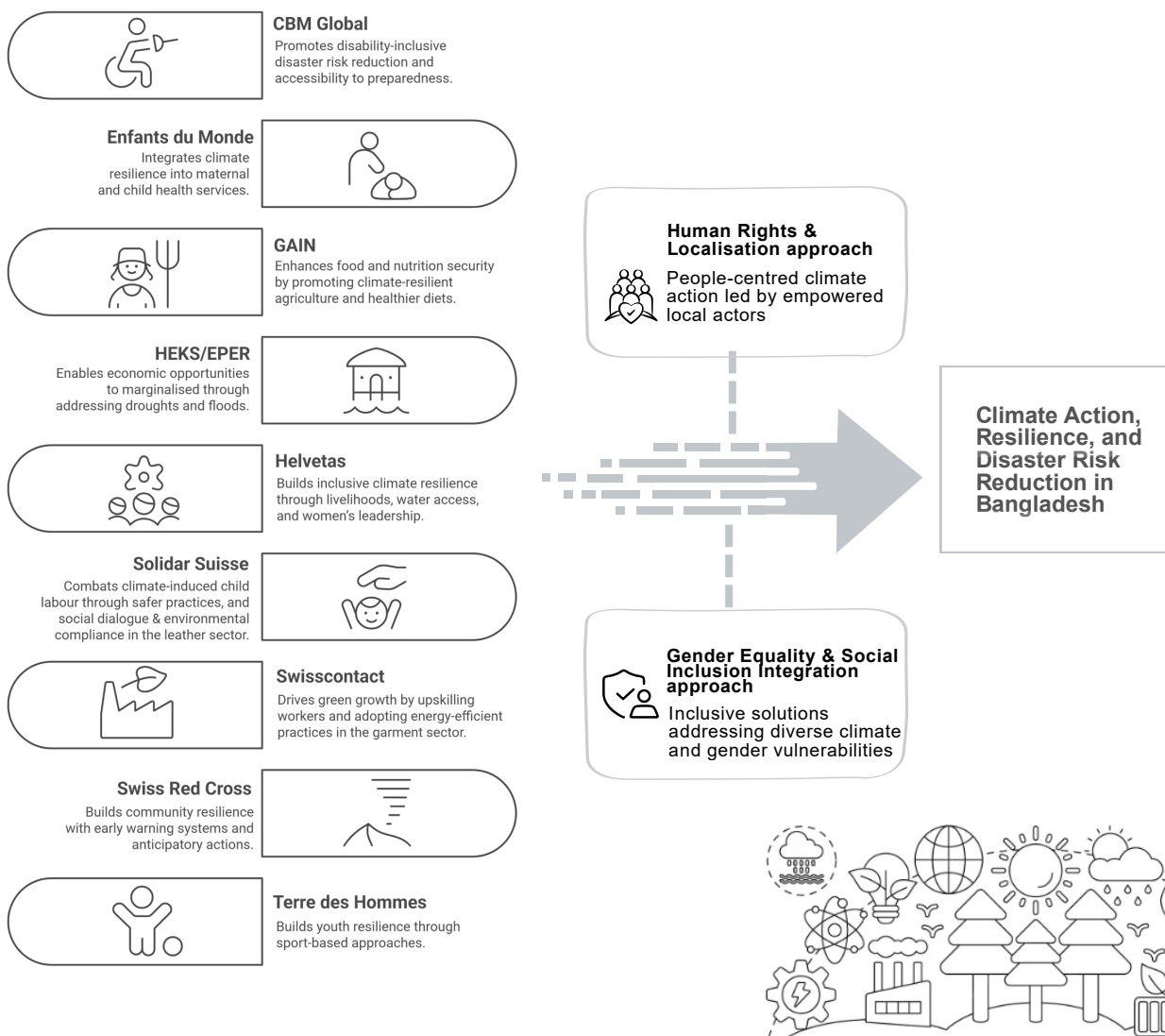


Figure: Contribution matrix of CALL consortium to climate resilient
